Stones and crystals are also another thing in America that the younger generation or Gen Z believes in. I feel like Americans believe in fate and that the Universe is in control. Another thing I noticed that people base their identity or personality off of is zodiac signs which also has to do with the stars, and they believe the different named and shaped stars that tell you what you are like as a person. I don't agree with any of this because I don't think nature is its own spirit and I don't believe that nature is in control of everything or that the Universe controls and balances everything. I believe in one God that creates balance, order, is in charge of the universe, the stars, and controls nature as well. I believe this because I see the uniqueness and science behind nature, the stars, and the universe. When I hear people's views that are opposite to mine what I hear a lot of them say is that everything is just energy and that it can positive or negative, but I don't believe we are just balls of energy I believe everything that is here was created with purpose. I believe that we were created with a purpose.
