Of course, since we are analyzing the Greeks, almost everything leads its way back to the gods.

Natural Disasters:

Many of the Greeks are said to be polytheistic, thus believing in the divine rule of many gods and goddesses, with each controlling a certain attribute of this world. Unlike many religions and cultures however, their gods and goddess portrayed human dispositions and emotions. Moreover, since these gods were far superior, large, and more powerful than the mortals of the earth, the Greeks feared, respected, and obeyed their orders. Uniquely, the Greeks believed that the wrath of the gods was due to their anger and conflict with other gods or humans themselves and was shown through diverse natural disasters that occurred throughout the world.

As a part of the early Toltec heritage the characteristic of Mesoamerican about the Cosmo Vision was opened by the indigenous people called "The Nahuas", they introduce the cosmogonic explanation of the universe and its natural phenomenon. Some of the planetary myths of the Nahuas, include the "Eternal fire of Heraclitus . Aristotle and Thales belief that everything is supplied by God", these was accepted as valid during their times. But this idea was an accepted myth even without validity. This belief and tradition have become problematic in its origin when new ideas and advance of information were outlined, and even if new scientific concepts was introduced some Nahuas continue to practice the language of philosophical myth of Philosophers like Plato and Aristotle who presented rational observations to help establish and rationalize their symbolic meaning.

But later, more Nahuas can distinguish the reality based on their observation and experiences as true and superstition and magic as false. To prove the validity of their findings they also experimented and acquired more knowledge to distinguish facts from fallacy such as the difference of medicine compared to witchcraft and sorcery which is the knowledge, they were looking for to be wise (trametinib). Their finding proves as their poem goes, the true doctor's remedies are tested, and he provide cure with scientific methods and knowledge based expertise to restore health, while the false physician provide wrong medicine, sometimes ridicules and deceive people to make their illness worse.
