### **Assignment 3: Ten Commandments**

This Assignment will explore the 10 Commandments as they appear in scripture, the debate over obeying the Ten Commandments from a Christian perspective, and the Old Testament concept of salvation and its relation to the Ten Commandments. The 10 Commandments are found in the book of Exodus, in the Bible, and are a set of moral laws that have been followed by many cultures throughout the years. Christians have long debated whether or not they should obey the Ten Commandments, as the New Testament does not.

The 10 Commandments, found in scripture in the books of Exodus and Deuteronomy, serve as an ethical code of conduct for both Jews and Christians. The 10 Commandments are a set of laws that provide structure for the lives of those who follow them and give a sense of purpose and meaning. The commandments are divided into two parts, the first five focusing on our relationship with God and the second five addressing our relationship with our fellow human beings.
