The 10 Commandments appear in both the Old and New Testaments of the Bible. According to PD Miller in his 2009 book, they are found in Exodus 20:1-17 and Deuteronomy 5:6-21. In the New Testament, they are referenced in various places, including Matthew 19:17-19, Mark 10:17-19, and Luke 18:20-22. Miller also discusses how the 10 Commandments are not only a moral code, but also a legal code that was intended to regulate society. He argues that the 10 Commandments represent the foundation of the law and justice system in the ancient Near East, and were intended to be the basis for all social order. Furthermore, Miller suggests that the 10 Commandments are also a reflection of God's holiness, and are an expression of His character and values. Thus, the 10 Commandments are an important part of Scripture, providing a moral and legal foundation for society, as well as a reflection of God's character and values. (Miller, 2009).

The concept of salvation in the Old Testament is closely linked to the Ten Commandments. According to Alex Varughese in *Discovering the Old Testament: Story and Faith* (2003), the Old Testament is a covenant between God and His people, and the Ten Commandments are the main principle of that covenant. JH Hayes and CR Holladay (2022) suggest that the Old Testament concept of salvation is based on a relationship between God and His people. Through this relationship, God's will and faithfulness can be seen and experienced. The Ten Commandments serve to remind us of the importance of living in alignment with this relationship and to recognize God's mercy and grace.

The 10 Commandments are found in Exodus 20 and in Deuteronomy 5, and is an important part of the Old Testament. While we can't earn our righteousness through keeping the commandments, it is still important to follow them as they are foundational to Christianity. The New Testament shows us numerous examples of Jesus's followers obeying the commandments, emphasizing their importance. In the Old Testament, people believed that salvation was obtained through their faith in God, but following the law was viewed as an act of faith and obedience to God.
