2. Anterograde amnesia is when a person's memory is stuck in the past. Due to some sort of trauma to the brain the individual is unable to remember anything new prior to the trauma or injury.

Retrograde Amnesia is the exact opposite that the person cannot remember the past and anything that happened prior to brain trauma or injury. This is often used in movies when someone wakes up from a fall and starts to wonder “ Who am I”.

7. The Amygdala is a part of the formation of the memory. The way memories are stored in the mind and brain that influence emotion in the body.

The Cerebellum is where memories are created and implicit an explicit conditioning. memories associated with this area of the brain sometimes is due to a condition response. Prefrontal cortex is a part of how memories or process and retained and used at a later time.
