1. What are the main benefits of developing a comprehensive project scope analysis?

Developing a comprehensive project scope analysis helps to define project goals, establish boundaries and constraints, identify stakeholders needs, risks, and potential issues, create a realistic timeline and budget, and increase the chances of project success through a shared understanding among team members and stakeholders.

2. What is a statement of work (SOW) and what are the main elements in an effective SOW?

A Statement of Work (SOW) is a document that outlines the specific tasks, deliverables, and requirements for a project or service contract. An effective SOW includes a project overview, a scope of work, deliverables, acceptance criteria, assumptions and constraints, resources required, payment terms, and signatures from both parties. These elements provide clarity and understanding for all parties involved, ensuring that the project is completed successfully and to the satisfaction of all stakeholders.

3. What is the Work Breakdown Structure (WBS)? What are its 6 main purposes?

In short, the WBS helps project managers plan and manage projects effectively. Its 6 main purposes are to define project scope, organize project work, allocate resources, facilitate planning, monitor progress, and communicate project information to stakeholders.

8. Describe the 5 stages of group development.

The five stages of group development are:

Forming: Members come together and get to know each other.

Storming: Conflict arises as members establish their roles and work towards goals.

Norming: Members resolve conflicts and establish norms and expectations.

Performing: The group works towards achieving its goals and objectives.

Adjourning: The group completes its tasks and disbands.

9. Describe the pros and cons of virtual project teams.

Pros:

- Geographical barriers are eliminated, allowing for a wider pool of talent to be utilized.
- Reduced costs associated with travel, office space, and other physical resources.

Cons:

12. Go to the website of a professional sports team. What clues do you get regarding the importance of teams and teamwork from this site? Discuss a few specific examples.

FC Bayern Munich is one of the biggest clubs in the world and has been playing at a top level for decades and has a big battle with the top clubs in Europe and around the world. Behind such a success there is usually not only good planning or hard work, but much more. Teamwork among the players is a big part, but the composition of the team must also be carefully considered, because just because a player is good doesn't mean that he fits into FCB's game philosophy. There are many critical points that need to be considered. Now, however, we want to take a look at the website of the well-known FC Bayern Munich.

When you open the club's page, you are first confronted with the club colors, because almost the entire page consists of the colors red, white and blue. First you see the latest news and statistics available in the club. The latest data on the latest game, women's football, the 123rd birthday of FCB and also the historical past and events related to FCB. For me this is already a sign of teamwork in the club, because not only the popular men's team is shown, but also all other teams and general news in the club. The individual teams do not differ and each is classified as equally important.

The team is the top priority at FCB and you can see that on the website. There are hardly any contributions from individual players, only from the team. Even in interviews, an individual person is rarely praised, but always several or the whole team are singled out.

Teamwork is the top priority at FCB, because no one can achieve such a great success as FCB alone, there is always a team behind it. The team works together on the pitch, the coaching team keeps a close watch and the managerial team takes care of the needs and strengthens the team and much more. There are not only 11 players on the field, because behind each player there are dozens of people who always support him and enable FCB to move into such a position.
