The five most important "Isms" of the early 19th century were:

- Conservatism
- Classical Liberalism
- Nationalism
- Utopian Socialism
- Romanticism

Conservatism focused on reintroducing the older period when a hereditary monarchical government was in power.

Classical Liberalism was the idea of the enlightenment, where people had more say in human government, allowing for the push for freedom to practice things such as religion and voting.
