Teach the patient how to identify the signs and symptoms of infection. 4. Demonstrate proper wound care after showering. 5. Ask the patient to state the signs and symptoms of infection. 6. Advise the patient on proper nutrition and to consume a diet high in protein and vitamin C. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Proper hand washing techniques help to prevent the spread of infection. 2. Checking the incision sight frequently will determine the process of wound healing. 3.
