

David Flusser was a Jewish scholar who specialized in the study of the New Testament and early Judaism. He was born in Austria in 1917 and later emigrated to Israel, where he taught at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. He authored numerous books and articles on Jewish-Christian relations, the Dead Sea Scrolls, and early Christianity.
