#2&3 : 3 stage social stages of personality development are: the oral sensory stage, Basic trust versus mistrust. Our textbook states, "In Erickson's view; the mother acts lovingly and consistently. The infant would likely develop a sense of true basic essentials both as mother and the infant. Interact. The infant would be able to recognize her using her five senses. A basic sense. This trust is created when the mother rejects the infant or shows no love or affection as the child ages. And. Where there is a positive resolution. Autonomy versus shame and doubt this stage is created when parents guide their children's behavior firmly to create autonomy.
