Week7: Attendance summary

Theme: Hope

Dr. Notley explaining the lesson on chapter 4 link and explaining week seven lesson. (Students asking questions and concerns with Dr. Notley). He explains about going to the lessons for questions and DQ for the courses.

One of Dr. Notley favorite topics (subjects of parables): The idea of image of God value one. Chapters of each one will be simple. (Genesis). The image of God is a concept in social subject, value or worth. People speaking about Jesus and why he sits around people that sins, Jesus's value and believes it worth the risk of being around the people that sins because he wants to help those that are sick not the healthy. Jesus is in the center of this new thinking (seed in the church, it spread the word of Jesus about God). The story about Jesus working(healing) a man on the Sabbath (to save a soul or destroy it?). We have to realize that these ideas are intended. How breaks the Sabbath? Did Jesus? Not if he doesn't touch them. Nothing he does that breaks the sabbath. The one who break Sabbath is God (Father)! God healed the sick man. (Questions from the class). Jesus's teaching was different than theirs. They were confused and to then it wasn't supposed to be like that. The ending of Luke (Luke6:11) thinking is about angry. (A student said to Dr. Notley) The term Luke speaks about a lake and not a sea. You have to be careful in your reading and understand it carefully.

The Imago Dei and the Value of One: You can't believe that everyone will be born and was going to hell. Everyone is created in God's own image. Many of the Jew thoughts that they all were greater than other people that weren't from their own group or even some of the other

Jews, they believed that some of their Jewish group weren't as great as them. Showing that they weren't right and God didn't like what they were doing and thinking. The image of God (king of the universe) It requires that we care for them. We need to teach them all the children or light and hate the children of darkness. Today many thinks there are people that are better than others now and days. (Dr. Notley speaking when he worked at construction about Buck and to show him love). If you cannot love him for any reason love him for, I created him. It was Bucks birthday and the Dr. Notley had to make a cake for Buck. (Bucks son). Jesus, the Pharisees, Purity and Alms: Luke 11:39-42 (But give for alms for those things which are within. Tobit 12:9: For almsgiving delivers from death, and it purifies every sin. Jesus is comparing to tax collectors and sinners. Luke 15:1-2, Luke 19:6, Aruch Completum 6.452. Jesus is being judge so he uses two through three parables. Luke 15: 8-10 woman about one coin that she has lost and there is joy. "God over one sinner who repents" (Students asking questions about the class).

Chapter 5: Real and supposed allegories: So, what's the deal with allegory? They usually represent something else with the message or the parables. They represent into what we mean. Were Jesus's parables made into allegories after the fact? Only one of Jesus's parables are allegories. (Matt 13:37-40). All this week is about allegories. The parable of the wicked tenants (Luke 20:9-19 and par.) "moral teaching". Every symbol in the parables has a specific meaning. This parable speaks or talk about power. They understood the meaning into that parable and the abuse of power. How do you know if a parable has been allegorized? Parable has four soils:

“The word”, “Is there a secondary allegory in the synoptic Gospel? Another example the treasure and the pearl. The mean the Kingdom. The idea of the kingdom is a later idea of the Christians. How God required Israel? Israel is Gods attraction and how he wanted Israel really badly. Three points to conclude:1. Explaining, 2. Lessons, and 3. Meaning. (Question or comments from the students). What is the moral or story of the parable?
