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This week was officially my second week of Clinical and I worked on the Med Surg unit which is on the 8b floor of Lincoln Hospital in the Bronx, with RN, Mr. Dorjee. I was assigned to a male 77-year-old patient, he is diagnosed with Prostate Cancer that spread to his lungs, and he is on comfort care. The patient needs chemotherapy and pain management, ADL, and he has poor appetite, when asked the patient states that his pain rate was a 9. He then received pain medication; the patient had no known allergies, his skin was intact he, he had no lesions. He is alter and oriented x 3, I took his vital signs, his temp was 97.7, pulse 69, RR was 18, B/P 119/76 and his O2 stat was 92%, when he was admitted for nausea and vomiting. The patient is continent, during my shift the patient had no urine output and no bowel movement. During the intervention the patient received he was able to get pain medication for his pain. The patient ate his lunch which was regular, he had 25% of his lunch and after lunch he got his pain medication, the patient rated his pain at 0 and he was able to sleep the remainder of my shift. I was able to assist the nurse with other patients that needed attention such as other patients who needed assistance to eat and get an oxygen tank for another patient that needed oxygen. At the end of my shift I was able to give a report about my patient.
