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The experience during this activity felt so real in my end because I was able to see the different issues with face in society within a group of 6 students. The activity felt authentic, and it became realistic because we share our true stories. It is very interesting how our group represent in some way an example of the whole population. The group is composed of three Black African Americans with different backgrounds, two Hispanic background, an Indian and a White American student. It was interesting how some of the members had experience some source of oppression and have examples in their personal lives related to the activity.

The scenario of the group started by the Black students bringing up some topics of oppression to the discussion and the way the White community is still privilege today. One of the students representing the Black community stated that Black still represents the highest number of people in jail and deprive of privileges systematically because of their skin color. Another student representing the Black community explained that is hard for him to walk out and be under certain situations that can make him a target of policy abuse. This member of the group expressed how he feels anxious to be outside and having to remember videos of the police abusing males his skin color. The student who represented the White community recognized the privilege White people have in society and the way she was raised with certain prejudice about Blacks. She expressed that her parents are racist and usually expressed concerns that she believes are not realistic. She shared that some of her sisters had married people of other culture and her youngest sister feels attracted to Black males. She expressed not understanding how her parents can be racist at this point in life. The Hispanic students expressed how they were victim of abused by

the Black White community when they first arrived at this country. They communicated the way they were segregated because of their accent. One of the members of the group expressed how the Black community rejects racism and want to be heard, but they also abused immigrants because they do not speak the language, having an accent, or having a different background. It was an experience that made me think about the phrase that “Hurt people, hurt people.” One of the Hispanic students narrated how a White lady told her that, when people hear her name, they expect the person to be white, with blue eyes and tall. It was an eye-opening activity in my opinion.
