The Life of A.B. Simpson and My Call

The Struggles and Triumphs of A.B. Simpson

A.B. Simpson was born on December 15, 1843, in Canada. He committed his life to follow Jesus Christ as his personal Savior at a tender age, and while he was still in his youth, he felt God calling him to a life of service in the church. Simpson first collapsed on all mental, physical, and spiritual levels when he was age 15. After Simpson studied the Gospel Mystery of Sanctification, he put his faith in Jesus Christ as his personal Savior. Shortly after, Simpson wrote a solemn covenant in which he committed to serving God. He was a skilled preacher and had successfully finished his studies at the university and the seminary.

The Charge to Engage in Evangelism and Missionary Work

Throughout his work in the ministry, he had many nervous breakdowns. When he returned home from Europe after recovery, he was shocked to discover that his son, who was only three years old, had passed away. After the calamity befell him, he was requested to take shelter at a Presbyterian Church in Louisville. He was highly active as a leader, which

contributed to the church's growth in size and the number of members. On the other hand, they came to resolve some financial concerns. Later on, he experienced what he referred to as a "Macedonian call," which led him to feel that the call was one that he should transmit since he wanted to have his influence felt across the globe. He left his job at the church in Louisville. He went to New York intending to minister to individuals of all socioeconomic backgrounds, publishing a missionary magazine, and assisting those in need. He also resigned from his position at the church in Louisville.

Divine Healing and Nyack College

One of the most remarkable aspects of his life was the concept that he preached about divine healing. He opened up many houses to those needing spiritual, physical, or financial assistance and provided this assistance in various ways. In 1882, he established what would later become Nyack College, a school for Bible study. A.B. Simpson founded various ministries and organizations, some successful and others not.

Observations I have Made After Completing the Course

The first thing that jumped out to me was the agreement between AB Simpson and his family. It struck me as really brilliant and courageous all at the same time. I believe that doing so is one thing that a Christian need to do since it will encourage you and help you concentrate on why you are living your life.
