1. In your own words explain Social-Emotional Learning (SEL)
 - a. Social- Emotional Learning is a term that is needed to be utilized more in the classroom today. It means the process of developing the self-awareness, self-control, and interpersonal skills that are necessary for school, work, and life successfully.
2. Describe five interrelated sets of cognitive, affective, and behavioral competencies at the heart of SEL.
 - a. The five interrelated sets are self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision. Social awareness means the ability to accurately recognize one's emotions and thoughts and their influence on behavior. Self-management is the ability to regulate one's emotions, thoughts, and behaviors effectively in different situations, and to set and work toward personal and academic goals. Social awareness is the ability to take the perspective of and empathize with others from diverse backgrounds and cultures and to recognize family, school, and community resources and supports. The relationship skills mean the ability to create and maintain healthy and rewarding relationships (with diverse individuals). Lastly Responsible decision making is the ability to make

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constructive and respectful choices about personal behavior and social interactions based on consideration of ethical standards.

3. Have you observed Social Emotional strategies in the classroom where you are doing field hours.

- a. During my observation Mrs. Romanitch told me that these 2nd graders had their first few years of school online. They had gone through preschool and first grade virtual and or hybrid. This means their social skills were lacking and she said she had to reteach how to interact with other students their age. While I was observing the student's partner reading, I saw how the students were very patient with each other.
