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During my clinical experience this week, my patient was a 6 year old with short gut syndrome. During my assessment, the patient had a left knee amputation, cortical blindness and had a surgical line on his abdomen from his organ transplant. My only challenge this week was monitoring my water intake because I can get so caught up throughout the day that I'll forget that I barely drank any water. My biggest accomplishment this week was that I was able to successfully complete a tracheostomy change and suction my patient. I had no bioethical concerns this week.

The verse that spoke to me the most for this clinical experience was Ephesians 3:20 (NLT), which says "Now all glory to God, who is able, through his mighty power at work within us, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think". I love this verse because sometimes I get so overwhelmed with my current problems, I forget that I prayed for the exact situation I'm in right now; I prayed for a job in December 2020, and God blessed me with a perfect one to accommodate my school schedule. I prayed to get into nursing school and God made a way for me to find Alliance University and enroll one week before campus opened. I say this to say that my God is so good and is a God that wishes to shower me in blessings. Instead of praying for something right now, I just want to take the time to thank God for my life. My life right now is drastically different from my life last year and I'm sure it will be different again this time next year. Thank you God for always holding me close and blessing me in health, family, love & all the desires of my heart. Amen.
