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During my clinical experience this week, My patient was a 18 year old male diagnosed with paralysis as a result of a gunshot to the neck. I was able to help the PCA's change the patient's clothes and bed and help administer finger sticks to other patients. My nurse was also really helpful with educating me on the medications the patients were taking and why. My greatest challenge this week was putting on sterile gloves during the catheterization of my patient. I had no problem putting on the gloves in the correct manner but I kept accidentally contaminating my sterile field or accidentally touching things that weren't sterile. Nevertheless, my instructor was very patient with me and my biggest accomplishment was that I was able to successfully catheterize the patient in the end. I had no bioethical concerns this week.

This clinical experience made me think of Isaiah 41:10, "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand" Although I most likely will not ever see my patients again, I pray that God heals their body from head to toe. I pray that he not only strengthens them physically but also mentally and spiritually so that they are equipped with righteous faith, unwavering family support and heavenly favor to assist in their journey to overcoming this trial. In Jesus name, Amen.
