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The Bible records the content of ten sincerity in Exodus 20:2-17 and Deuteronomy 5:6-21. Have you found that in fact, many of the contents of Shicheng are the fundamental truth of our faith, the truth that every Christian must learn and know. At the same time, the commandment is not to restrain us, but the benefit of sincerity is to benefit people.

Should Christians abide by the "ten sincerity"? Does God give you ten sincerity to control people or out of love? In fact, we all know that parents tell their children not to play with fire, which is good for their children. When God tells people to say "no", it is for our benefit with positive goals. It's like we need traffic lights to walk on the road. If we don't have it, we will run around. If it's a mess, people and cars will have accidents. So we should give us the "inno" law by God. Thank God!

Some Christians think that the Ten Commandments are a matter of the Old Testament, and Christians in the New Testament do not have to abide by them. We should understand that the law and sincerity is to bring people completely to Christ. Because the law and sincerity make people see their own appearance, we cannot fully obey the law by ourselves. We can only believe in the Lord and hope that the Lord gives us the strength to fulfill the righteousness of the law. Jesus said, "Don't think that I have come to abolish the law and the prophets; I have not come to abolish it, but to fulfill it." Matthew 5:17) In Christ, all this can be completed. Therefore, Christians in the grace of the new covenant should follow the Ten Commandments. Who needs ten sincerity? The Ten Commandments of Moses came from God and were written with God's own hands. Two stone tablets written by hand on Mount Sinai were handed over to Moses and passed on to the people of Israel. At the same time, we should also understand that Shicheng is an order, not a suggestion. So if someone asks: Who needs to abide by the ten orders? The answer is very simple: everyone needs it!

Some people wrote this: The Ten Commandments hold you to sin like a reins; the Ten Commandments are still like a mirror, illuminating a true self; the Ten Commandments are like a thermometer to measure your love for God; Ten Commandments also play the role of guardians, bringing people into love; Ten Commandments lead people to Christ, and only Christ can forgive and Give people the power to start a new life. It can be said that Shicheng summed up all the will that God revealed to us.

The general outline of the law is to love God and love others as yourself. The first four commandments of the ten commandments are about how to love God, and the last six commandments are about how to love others. The general outline of the law is love. When the New Testament Christians receive the Holy Spirit to pour the love of God into our hearts, they should reveal this love through our deeds, so that the world can be blessed through us. Therefore, we should show the holiness and righteousness of God through Christ. Today, we share the first four commandments of the Ten Commandments: How to fear God.

The principle of fear of God is to love God (Deuteronomy 6:5), and the love of God is expressed in serving God. Just as children love their parents and respect their parents in action, those who love God will definitely give the best to God. Redemption means that after a person's character and temperament deteriorates, it is forced to correct by the outside world. A Hebrew word with a similar meaning is "release", which is one of the important teachings of Christianity. It is Christ's way to save the world. In order to atone for salvation, people must believe and pray to Jesus.

Lude in the Old Testament describes such a situation. The prophets and apostles used the Atonement of the Old Testament to explain what God did for us. We are extremely poor morally and spiritually, so we sold our inheritance and thus became slaves to sin, but God has redeemed our sins for us through the death of his son. When Jesus Christ comes, he will restore our inheritance and give us a place in heaven.

The content of the Ten commandments appears three times in the Old Testament. The records in Exodus 20:2-17 and Deuteronomy 5:6-21 are roughly the same. Traditional Judaism believes that what is recorded here is the content of the first time God gave the Ten Commandments; what is recorded in Exodus 34:10-27 is the content of the second time the Ten Commandments, that is, It is recorded on the slate in the ark of the covenant. Modern basic theory holds that these two different records come from different biblical backgrounds, and are finally integrated into the Old Testament.

1. " "Ten Commandments" is in the 20th chapter of Exodus of the Old Testament. This book tells the record of the Israelites who led the Lord (God) to leave Egypt as slaves under the people whom he chose.

2. This journey was led by the prophet Moses of the Israelites through the wilderness to Mount Sinai to the land of Canaan, the kingdom promised by the Lord (God).

3. In Mount Sinai, the Lord (God) promulgated commandments, ordinances, laws, and the details of the construction of the tabernacle represented that from then on, the Lord (God) came from heaven to earth with people and gave them victory and peace to enter the promised land.
