The videos are about four prison epistles by Paul are essential in understanding the development of early Christianity and the formation of the early church. Lastly the video on Colossians explains how this letter was written to a church that was facing false teaching that was threatening the believers' faith. Paul's message in this

letter is that Christ is the supreme authority, above all other powers and authorities, and that the believers' faith in Christ is sufficient for their salvation.
