

1. The book is called "Paul the Jewish Theologian" by Brad H. Young. There are 272 pages and it costs around \$29.95.
2. Brad H. Young is a professor of Biblical Literature and the founder and president of the Gospel Research Foundation. He writes to help explain the New Testament more with rabbinic sources and literature.

Chapter 1- This chapter is the introduction and it talks about who Paul is as well as what the context of this book includes. He explains how Paul's views were shaped and how it made his beliefs what they are.

Chapter 2-This chapter is called "Paul the Jewish Theologian" and it talks about how Paul lived in a Jewish environment, being a Pharisee among Christians, his connection to the Torah and law, and his thinking as a Jew.

Chapter 3-This chapter is called "Pentecost, the Nations of the World, and the Apostle Paul" and it talks about the celebration of Pentecost among everyone, and the importance of it. He talks about the importance of this moment for everyone in terms of their faith.

Chapter 4-This chapter is called "Judaism and Christianity: Diverse Perspective on Torah" and it talks about how their views differed when it came to the Torah in terms of Jesus and Paul.

Chapter 5-This chapter is called " The Torah: Roots of Grace and Faith in Paul's Message" and it talks about the relationship between the Old Testament and the faith of the early church. It also says how Paul's messages help us live in faith and grace.

Chapter 6-This chapter is called "The Dead Letter or the Living Word?" and it talks about how Paul approached the Torah and how it should be looked at as. He continues to explain how these concepts are supposed to be acted on in the world.

Chapter 7-This chapter is called "The Transcendence of Torah in Paul's Teachings" and it talks about how Paul's view of the Torah goes past the common view of it and how this view relates and contrasts with the actions of living by it.

Chapter 8-This chapter is called "Love as the Foundation of Christian Ministry: The Model of 1 Corinthians 13" and it talks about how this "love" verse by Paul was written and its reasoning and explanation for it.

Chapter 9-This chapter is called "The Essence of Paul's Jewish Faith" and it talks about how we should understand the aspects of the faith and how we need to appreciate and look at where it started to where it is now.

Chapter 10-This chapter is called “Seven Pillars of Paul’s Jewish Theology” and it talks about all the seven principles of Paul’s views. He argued the emphasis and importance on all of these as being the basis of what he believes.

4. One book that can be compared to "Paul the Jewish Theologian" is “The Jewish Apostle Paul: Rethinking One of the Greatest Jews that Ever Lived” by Eli Lizorkin-Eyzenberg. Both of these books talk about Paul from the Jewish perspective of his life and he influenced people with this perspective. The major difference between the two are that Young’s writing had a more academic feel to it while Eyzenberg had a more personal approach.
