

1: Turkey had slaughtered more than a million Armenians during World War 1, during the 1930s and 1940s the Japanese killed millions of people across Asia. In Soviet Union the number of killed people was beyond more than eight million. The German slaughtered 6 million Jewish and millions more during World War 2. In the 1950s and 1960s the communist Chinese killed 30 million. 100 million people were the victims of genocide in other countries all over the world.

In Rwanda more than 8 million of men, women, and children had been killed during the passage of time. Most of them were killed by the majority people in the country. It means because some tribes were the minority, they were slaughtered by the people who were the majority.

In Guatemala 200 thousand indigenous Maya were slaughtered by the government during the 1980s. In Germany the reason was superiority and inferiority. During the World War 2 in concentration camps Jewish were massacred in Germany. In many places religion was a reason to genocide and in some other places elimination was a reason.

2: The pattern was the same in every genocide, men, women, and children were killed. All of them were taken out of their families and killed. Women sometimes were killed instantly, alive, and after being raped. People were burnt alive. In all genocides leaders were in charge. There was mass killing and even people were buried alive.

3: War, racism, religion was involved in these genocides. The genocide of Jewish in Germany happened during the World War 2. Civil war was a reason in Cambodia. Serbia's genocide was about religion. In Rwanda it was race that led to genocide. In Bosnia religion was the reason. Muslims were taken in the camps and then they were killed. Raping, torturing, killing, and elimination was the pattern that they were following.

4: All leaders were the one who decided to start the war. "Genocide is always politics." In 2008 the president of the United States response to mass killing of Armenians. In South Sudan the president was condemned to campaign for the genocide of people and international community didn't response to that genocide. World leaders have not intervened to these mass killings that happened in the world because they were distracted and have so much to do. United Nations gets out of the Rwanda right when the genocide was started and left there. And the international community watch that more than 800,000 Rwandans be massacred by government forces.

5: Civilians should be protected in armed conflicts, the armed conflicts should be prevented from happening, the leaders who have done genocide should be asked to the international courts and answered why that happened, military actions should be watched by United Nations. And the most important minorities should be protected.
