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This week was officially my final week of Clinical and I worked on the Med Surg unit which is on the 8b floor of Lincoln Hospital in the Bronx, with RN, Ms. Gengi. The greatest challenge I faced was working in a hospital environment, knowing that there is a shortage of nurses, and the nurses are being pressured into having more than required patients. The patient I was assigned to be a 70-year-old male, diagnosed with seizure, he has no known allergies and his AHCD was full code. He is alert and oriented times 2 which is to person, place, he has no heart murmur, he has effort normal and breath sound normal. The patient's skin is intact with no lesion, no pressure ulcer, he is not connected to oxygen, and he has an IV attached. His temp was 98.0, pulse was 86, RR was 18, B/P was 129/79 and O2 was 100. He had a regular diet, he was connected to a urine catheter, his output was 100, but he had no bowel movement. The patient has physical therapy pending, his ADL's is total assistant, he is on fall risk precautions, he was given blood thinner and antiseizure medication.
