MEETING(S) WITH MENTOR(S)    TOPICS OF DISCUSSION    REFLECTIONS
<p>In light of the awakening that has been happening at Asbury University in Kentucky, my mentor and a few other pastors had an excellent discussion about revival. Pastor Nick cautioned us not to jump too ebulliently on the bandwagon, asking, “What does a move of God look like?” He said we need to subtly teach others and to be wise in our messaging. God is stirring His people, but we need to respond in the proper manner. I find this to be excellent advice, as I am easily stirred to enthusiasm and joy. It is a fine line to tread, being confident in a move of God but not overdoing it so that we do not quench a more gentle move of the Spirit; I realize that revival begins in each individual heart, but I also realize that I <i>WANT, even LONG FOR</i> revival badly not just for me but for my nation and the world as well. Am I perhaps pushing the desire of my heart rather than prophesying what is truly on God’s heart? (I do think revival is on His heart! But the timing belongs to the Lord. Has the Church reached the true state of repentance that is required?)</p> <p>Ps Nick also cautioned about how we present ourselves. One of our congregants, a very godly man, has taken an Instagram handle that includes “pastor”; that is a title we need to be careful with—it’s a tremendous responsibility. Amen!</p>
