Looking back, I love to always in my walk on earth to be super considerate, super productive and super healthy emotionally, spiritually, physically, stewardship-wise and it is not normal to expect every week and each season to be this way though for about 47 years this has been my hope and longing.

#### T- threats to well-being and trauma

Trauma has solely been through living in a family that has much to celebrate yet for some reason we do not encourage with words or celebrate officially or unofficially except for birthdays and holidays. I see other backgrounds that struggled and have inspiring words of public and private affirmation and I so long for this. 90% of the trauma has been through vicious, unsolicited, super duper hot tempered explosive words of accusation, negativity, belittling from my immediate family. I have been protected from traumatic events even when as a teenager I was open to violence and gangs and romance with fast-paced gangster girls I was protected.

#### F-family background and history

This I can write a lot on. My mom's side has korean royalty culminating in her grandfather who was martyred by the japanese colonial government who invaded korea. This grandfather and his brother helped to end the class system of privilege

based on family association and economic slavery. They were open to vigilante methods and even kidnapped a king to make their mark against the ruling Korean aristocracy who sold out to the imperialist conquerors. One brother designed the Korean flag. One married the last princess of a dynasty. I recently learned their names and a historian has been feeding me bits of information that gel with the bits and pieces my mom has mentioned over the years. Because my mom lost her dad at the age of 5, and traumatically, she has a whole in her heart for her birth father. Don't forget, the history books largely dismiss him as a radical who sided against Korea when he and his brother went clearly against the king who represents Korean dynasty. My mom's mom was forced to enter into a marriage of convenience and resulted in my mom having two step sisters and a step brother. Each of them divorced. The oldest half sister got divorced then died in her early 60's. Her ex-husband died at this age too. The next half sister divorced and we haven't seen or heard from her. The brother is a monk who took a vow of silence and lives in a far away Korean mountain. As much as my mom raised me with seasons of fire (she organized the Korean moms in Closter, NJ in the 80's to take over the public school for a day to celebrate Korean heritage because she and a teacher thought I didn't know my roots) and seasons of being emotionally checked out, I know I inherit compassion, civic grass roots leadership and a yearning for social justice from her side.

My father has three brothers who are all remarkably similar - they will all win in a contest of hard work and perseverance through business if one existed. They each bought land and buildings to begin in the food wholesale distribution business, one brother in LA, one in Chicago, one in Korea, my dad in Brooklyn. And they each ended up developing their industrial land to mixed-use multi-family and commercial maxed out,

highest and best use buildings. But my dad was differentiated: He had no debt, no partners, not even qualified managers. Every dream was best of the best and every cost was lowest of the low. But the thing is he raised me, maybe by default, to see things in a native american and nyc cosmopolitan, metropolitan, sophisticated way. I was the developer who developed the raw land and underutilized industrial building (I through Holy Spirit was responsible for the best of the best designs) that my father acquired (when I was born and then another big purchase when I was in middle school).
