## Jason Gysbers - Blood Clots Signs & Symptoms Medical Protocol

Jason has several blood clots in his right leg and is currently taking blood thinners to help eliminate those clots. Jason takes Warfarin 1 (the dose varies) time a day at 6:00pm; because he is on a blood thinner if he gets a cut he will bleed more. Because Jason has blood clots he is at a higher risk of a stroke or heart attack. Staff need to monitor Jason for any signs or symptoms of a stroke or heart attack. Staff will need to contact management if Jason ever has a wound that does not stop bleeding. Staff need to take any concerns or complaints Jason has about how he is feeling seriously.

**IF Jason reports or staff observe any of the following symptoms 911 needs to be called immediately and then someone in the chain of command needs to be contacted.**

### Signs & Symptoms to Monitor Jason for:

- Shortness of Breath
- Tightness or pressure of his chest
- Drowsiness, lethargy, or loss of consciousness
- Loss of Memory
- Mood Changes
- Numbness or weakness a part of his body other than the right leg from the knee down, especially in face or arm, especially on one side.
- Trouble Speaking
- Trouble seeing with one or both eyes
- Trouble walking or staying balanced or coordinated
- Dizziness
- Severe headache that comes on for no reason
- Sweating
- Nausea
- Pain in the chest, back, jaw and other areas of the upper body that lasts more than a few minutes or that goes away and comes back.
