Summary of Service Outcome and Support Progress

Outcome # 1

Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: Karen will check in with staff daily, 70% of all trials until next review.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: Karen achieved this outcome 97/97 trials or 100%.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

Rationale for the recommendation: Karen achieved this outcome as written but says that being more open and communicating with staff is still one of her most important personal goals. Karen said that stay normally approach her to check-in, but she would like to change this outcome to specify that Karen will be the one to independently reach out to staff.

Outcome # 2

Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: Karen will record her work completed, 70% of all trials until next review.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: Karen achieved this outcome 89/89 trials or 100%.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

<p>Health: Karen has been in good health this review period.</p> <p>What is currently important to the person and for the person: The important to Karen items are: Karen's family, dogs, and having her niece back in MN. The important for Karen items are: Maintaining good health, being happy, and continuing to have opportunities in the community.</p> <p>Status of social relationships and natural supports: Karen has had pretty consistent social supports among her family, residence, and at PAI, but covid-19 this year has greatly impacted Karen. Karen is happy to be back to full days at PAI and be able to see more of her peers and staff here. Karen prefers interactions in person, but unfortunately for the second year in a row (because of covid-19) Karen has had to have her annual meeting virtually.</p> <p>Recent inclusion and participation in the community: PAI has not resumed community outing yet at this time due to ongoing covid-19 health and safety concerns.</p> <p>New or ongoing opportunities for the development and exercise of functional and age-appropriate skills, decision making and choice, personal advocacy, and communication: Karen is involved in decisions that impact her. Karen chooses how many and which leisure and skill building classes she takes at PAI. Karen chooses which community activities to participate in.
