Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement:

**Christina will propel her wheelchair for a short distance (10-20 ft)
to access community, on-site and group experience in 85% or more of trials for the next 12 months.**

Methods or actions that will be used to support the person and to accomplish the outcome:

Christina enjoys spending time in the community and attending on-site group activities. It is important to her that she have opportunities to participate in experiences she would like and that she be as independent as able. This outcome provides opportunities for Christina to strengthen her independence by propelling her wheelchair to access experiences she is interested in.

Christina will not be asked to propel her wheelchair in a parking lot or to enter a community building during wet or cold weather.

1. While in the community or to access on-site group/community experiences, Christina will be verbally encouraged to independently propel her own wheelchair for a short distance (1-20 ft) with statements such as:

“Christina, let’s check out _____!” “Christina, will you come with me to _____?” or “Christina, let’s go to _____.”

2. Staff will walk alongside Christina and slightly in front of her to provide directional cues as she propels herself

Example:

If Christina is going shopping at Target, staff will propel her wheelchair through the front doors and then verbally prompt her to propel herself to the “Dollar Spot”, or while in an aisle prompt her to propel herself to the nail polish selection. Christina may also propel herself up to the cash register when it is time to make a purchase.

If Christina has indicated she would like to attend an onsite enrichment or group activity, she will be assisted by staff to the program room door and then verbally prompted to propel herself to where the experience is happening.

If Christina propels her own wheelchair to access a community/group experience, the outcome will be documented as achieved (**Y**). If Christina does not propel her to access a community/group experience, the outcome will be documented as not achieved (**N**). If Christina does not propel her chair, staff will confirm with her that she wants to attend the activity and then ask Christina if she would like assistance to propel her chair during/to the experience.

Changes or modifications necessary to the physical and social environments:

Equipment and/or materials required:

Christina’s wheelchair and a community or group activity she would like to participate in

Techniques that are used that are consistent with the person’s communication mode:

Christina communicates non-verbally by establishing eye contact, making vocalizations, facial expressions, and using her communication devices. She will pointing to or grabbing things she wants and dropping things she does not want. Christina is receptive to short verbal phrases in English, delivered in a friendly tone, and physical cues. Christina has a hearing impairment so it is important to stand in front of Christina when speaking to her and make eye contact if able.

Techniques that are used that are consistent with the person’s learning style:

Christina learns through repetition, once a routine has been established. She is best supported with modeling, verbal and physical prompts.

Data collection method:

This outcome will be recorded and charted each time Christina attends a group or community experience. Charting will include a “Y” or “N” indicating success.
