Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement:	
Once daily, Kimmy will indicate a staff and/or peer that she would like to visit in 90% of all trials over the next year.	
Methods or actions that will be used to support the person and to accomplish the outcome:	
This outcome will be trialed daily.	
Kimmy will be presented with 2 staff and/or peers to visit. Staff will ask Kimmy if she would like to visit person A or Person B. Staff will then say their names again giving Kimmy time to respond to each name. If Kimmy chooses a staff and/or peer, she would like to visit the outcome will be documented as achieved (y) and staff will assist Kimmy in visiting the chosen peer and/ staff. If Kimmy does not make any choices staff will ask her again later in the day. If she still does not choose a staff and/or peer to visit, the outcome will be documented as not achieved (n). Staff will honor her communication and choices.	
Changes or modifications necessary to the physical and social environments:	
Kim may become overstimulated in loud/busy environments indicated by yelling, spitting, pinching, hitting, or grabbing at others. Should this occur, she will be assisted to a less stimulating area prior to asking her to practice this skill.	
Equipment and/or materials required:	
There are no additional materials needed.	
Techniques that are used that are consistent with the person's communication mode:	
Kim communicates non-verbally using facial expressions, vocalizing, and waving. Kim knows adaptive signs for eat, more, drink and yes but does not use them consistently. Kim communicates by touching people or things she would like & pushing away items she is not interested in. Kim prefers to be provided choices that honor her known preferences. Kim is able to understand and respond to short concise verbal cues and phrases in English; she prefers an upbeat tone from caregivers and time to process requests.	
Techniques that are used that are consistent with the person's learning style:	
Kim enjoys completing tasks for herself, she learns though routine and repetition. She is best supported with verbal prompts, staff modeling prompts, and at times benefits from physical prompts. Kim is less receptive to hand over hand supports.	
Data collection method:	
Documentation will be recorded daily. Charting will include a "Y" indicating a successful trial or "N" indicating an unsuccessful trial.	
Names of staff or positions responsible for implementing the supports and methods:	
Program Supervisor (PS), Lead Direct Support Professional (LDSP), and Direct Support Professionals (DSP).
