Summary of Service Outcome and Support Progress

Outcome # 1

Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: Robert will raise his hand when he needs more work material on the work floor, 85% of all trials until next review.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: Robert achieved this outcome 39/42 trials or 93% of trials.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

Rationale for the recommendation: Robert has achieved this outcome. Robert will continue to be encouraged to work on this skill, but tracking of the outcome will be discontinued.

Outcome # 2

Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: Robert will pick and participate in 1 community activity from a provided list each month, 70% of all trials until next review.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: No data.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

Rationale for the recommendation: Making personal choices and staying active in the community are still goals of Robert's. This outcome will be continued when it is safe for community activities to resume.

Description of the person's status

Health: Robert fractured his foot in January and still has a cast. Robert's residence reported that they would be setting up an appointment for a swallow evaluation soon, but PAI has not been updated on the status. Robert has otherwise been in good health his review period.

What is currently important to the person and for the person: The important to Robert items are: his dog Bentley, working and making a paycheck, and staying busy and active. The important for Robert items are: physical supports during the day, following his prescribed diet and having support to attend his dialysis appointments, and staying active in his community.

Status of social relationships and natural supports: Robert has had consistent social supports at home and at PAI this review period. Robert has been able to see more and more of his peers back at PAI over the last few months. Robert sometimes talks about missing his dog Bentley, who is no longer loving with Robert.

Recent inclusion and participation in the community: community outings are currently on hold at PAI due to ongoing covid-19 health and safety concerns.

New or ongoing opportunities for the development and exercise of functional and age-appropriate skills, decision making and choice, personal advocacy, and communication: Robert is involved in making decisions that impact him Robert chooses how many and which leisure and skill building classes to take at PAI, but usually prefers to not take any. Robert chooses which community activities he would like to do. Robert chooses to work on-site but knows that PAI offers other employment services if he ever wishes to pursue community employment.

Status of the person's civil and legal rights: Robert exercises his rights at PAI and does not have any right restrictions.
