Summary of Service Outcome and Support Progress

Outcome # 1

Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: Once daily, Jerome will make eye contact during a conversation in 75% of all trials over the next six months.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: Jerome has been successful in 100% of all opportunities over the last 6 months.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

Rationale for the recommendation: Jerome has been very successful with this outcome. A new suggested outcome would include visiting another programming space, while following COVID restrictions, and make eye contact with a staff or participant in that room.

Outcome # 2

Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: Daily, Jerome will reach for his bottle during lunch time in 80% off trials over the next six months.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: Jerome has been successful in 100% of all opportunities over the last 6 months.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

Rationale for the recommendation: Jerome has also been very successful with this outcome. A new suggested outcome could include Jerome choosing a bottle to have for the day when he arrives at PAI. This outcome allows Jerome to make a choice of something that he really enjoys.

Description of the person's status

Health: There are no current health concerns this reporting period.

What is currently important to the person and for the person: It is important to Jerome that he have spicy foods and preferred manipulatives to hold and have access to such as bottles, that he has time to relax and nap, that he has time to people watch, and that he has sensory time. It is important for Jerome that he have repositioning throughout his day, that he is encouraged to be as independent as possible, that he has adequate fluid intake and balanced meals, and support to be social and engaged in activities with others.

Status of social relationships and natural supports: Jerome has developed quiet, friendly relationships with peers in his program area, and with support staff that he enjoys. Due to the COVID restrictions, Jerome stays in the same programming room, which has given the opportunity to get to know new individuals that he may not have been with prior to the pandemic.

Recent inclusion and participation in the community: Due to the Coronavirus, there have not been any opportunities for community integration.

New or ongoing opportunities for the development and exercise of functional and age-appropriate skills, decision making and choice, personal advocacy, and communication:

- **Functional and age-appropriate skills:**
 - Music Therapy: Jerome has continued to work on both fine and gross motor skills in this group and sensory integration while participating in music therapy virtually. Jerome often shows interest in the music by smiling throughout the session.
 - Jerome is given time to eat his meal prior to receiving assistance from his staff. Jerome also continues to work on his upper body mobility by leaning forward and reaching out, especially for bottles.
- **Decision making and choice:** Jerome continues to make choices using picture cards and the iPad. He is provided options throughout his day to make choices and decisions. His decisions are honored.
- **Personal Advocacy:** Jerome has been a strong self-advocate in communicating his discomfort and needs. As he has experienced discomfort with the physical changes he is experiencing, he will vocalize to advocate for himself when he requires support. This communication has allowed his support staff to provide appropriate care and speak with his team to work to best support him.
- **Communication:** Jerome continues to communicate through vocalizations, reaching for things, eye gazing, adaptive switches, and facial expressions. Jerome best understands physical cues and one step verbal prompts from those supporting him. He responds to picture cards and the iPad choice board. Jerome would like his communication to be honored and supported throughout his day.

Status of the person's civil and legal rights: Jerome has private guardianship provided by Pat O'Neill. Jerome's civil and legal rights continue to be protected at PAI. Jerome would like to be aware of his rights and has a support team who is also aware and advocate on his behalf. Jerome would like to have his communication honored and make choices and decisions throughout his day.
