Description of the person's status

Health: There are no health concerns regarding Keith.

What is currently important to the person and for the person: It is important to Keith to have time to spend socializing with favorite peers and staff during the day. It is also important to Keith to have sunny windows to sit near throughout his day. It is important for Keith that he have opportunities to be physically active during his day and that he maintains the integrity of the skin on his hands. It is important for Keith that he does not bump his feet causing a gout flair ups, he uses his communication skills to advocate for his preferences, he is supported and encouraged to be social and engage in activities with others, and to be as independent as he is able with daily living tasks.

Status of social relationships and natural supports: Keith's family continues to be involved and very important to him. Keith enjoys spending time with friends and peers at PAI. Keith has strong relationships with his support staff, he seeks his favorite people out during his day for hugs and kissy sounds.

Recent inclusion and participation in the community: Due to the pandemic, PAI has not been visiting the community.

New or ongoing opportunities for the development and exercise of functional and age-appropriate skills, decision making and choice, personal advocacy, and communication:

Functional and age-appropriate skills: Due to the pandemic, we are still participating in music therapy virtually. Keith tends to smile when the drums are played near him. Keith has really enjoyed participating in bowling while in center. He will often come up to the bowling ball stand, push the ball by himself, and then watch the ball as it collides with the pins. During the time of this activity, he will come up often and frequently to participate in it. Keith also seems to enjoy participating in an obstacle course. Cones are set up in the room, and he is assisted in navigating through the cones to the finish line. He will often smile and laugh while navigating through the cones.

Decision making and choice: Choices are offered to Keith throughout his day so he may make his own decisions. He makes decisions regarding his daily schedule, personal routine, and which groups/activities he would like to participate in. Keith communicates his choices by going to what he wants, or away from things he is not interested in, facial expressions, vocalizations, and is working to consistently touch the item he wants instead of throwing the less preferred options. His communication and decisions are honored.

Personal advocacy: Keith generally goes with the flow. He does advocate for some of his needs, such as going up to the counter where his drink is located when he is thirsty or activating the restroom switch when needing assistance with personal supports. Keith is encouraged and supported in his communication to have his needs and desires met. It is important that he have support people around him that know him well and advocate for the needs and desires that he may not be able to communicate to the appropriate team members.

Communication: Keith communicates nonverbally but responds to verbal and physical cues once a routine is established. Keith will make his choices by eye gazing and continues to work on touching the item he wants instead of throwing the less preferred item. Keith will also go toward things or activities he would like to do. Keith will laugh and look up when he likes something. When not interested in an activity Keith will move or pull away.

Status of the person's civil and legal rights: Keith's is provided private guardianship by his father and brothers. Keith's civil and legal rights are maintained at PAI. Keith would like to continue to be aware of his rights, and have a support team who upholds his rights, and advocates on his behalf. Keith would like to continue having his communication honored and make choices and decisions throughout his day.
