It is important for Andrew to continue to participate in PAI, his day program, to pursuing the life he loves as well as meaningful participate in the community.

It is important for Andrew to be surround by people who are familiar with his so that they know signs and symptoms of illness, injury, any type of possible abuse, neglect, and satisfaction, health, medical, dental, safety, etc. concerns and take the proper actions at the time of these concerns. It is also important for Andrew to continue to have and use the developmental disabilities waiver through medical assistance which pays for his support staff to keep his healthy and safe across all settings.

Rituals and routines: Guardian reported that Andrew wakes up, goes to the bathroom, completes grooming routine, eats breakfast (soft diet), goes to his play area where there are books and his computer where he is able to access Youtube and movies, eats lunch that is prepared for him, and goes for a walk outside in the stroller to a nearby park including Como Park. In the evening, Andrew eats dinner, completes hygiene tasks such as brushing his teeth and goes to bed

between 9:30-10 PM. Andrew takes medication in the morning. When Andrew is attending PIA, he gets up in the morning and completes his morning hygiene routine and gets ready for the day, he gets very excited to go to PIA. After he gets home they take him to the bathroom and have a snack. His parents report that Andrew does best with a very structured routine so he knows what is going on.

Natural supports: Guardian reported that Andrew's brother and sister are his natural supports. Andrew's parents report that when they are not home Andrew will look to his siblings for support. PIA noted that he is very friendly and likes to use his communication tablet to say hello to others.

Hopes and dreams: Guardian reported that they would like Andrew to continue to receive services in the community and continue to live with their family. The guardians report that they would like to start doing more community outings with him now that COVID restrictions have been lifted.

Skills and strengths: Guardian reported that Andrew is social, loving, and family-oriented. The guardian also shared that Andrew loves to read and be read to; he particularly likes the books Chicka chicka boom boom and good night moon.

Religion and leisure: Guardian reported that Andrew is non-religious. He celebrates birthdays and holidays including Fourth of July. Andrew likes gatherings, having people over to his house, BBQs, going to the beach, and he looks forward to an annual family trip to Florida.

Employment: Andrew is currently participating in a day program through PAI.

Housing: Guardian reported that Andrew appears to like living with his parents in their house.

Strengths/Talents Andrew is a very kind and positive person with an upbeat personality. Andrew shows a lot of compassion and love to those around him despite being nonverbal, and he communicates extremely well through emotional response.

Interests/ Preferences: Andrew loves spending time with his family and is very affectionate towards his parents. Andrew is a good-natured individual, and he enjoys watching videos on YouTube and reading books. When he wants someone to read to him, he will get his book of choice and lead someone to his room to read, he particularly loves chica chica boom boom and Goodnight Moon.

Ambitions/Hopes: Andrew's parents, report that they hope Andrew continues to enjoy his day program PAI, and engage in activities with staff and peers there. Parents' wishes are for Andrew to continue to live with his family and receive the level of support that he needs. Parents hope Andrew to gain more communication skills, so he is able to communicate/interact with others when he is in the community. Parents also hope Andrew to live as happily as possible.

Parents report people like most about Andrew is that he is positive and motivated to live his best life. He is a good person with lot of compassion and love to those around him.

What the person wants others to know about how to best work with them: Andrew does best with routine, and structure anticipated activities. He relies on family/others to keep him on track with his daily activities.

Any pertinent social history: Andrew has been diagnosed with severe developmental disability as a child. He has history of blocked tear duct

surgery and anal stenosis.

Action Steps for Goals:

What will the person do?

Andrew will continue to work with informal and formal support to build and maintain all skills necessary to achieve his goals. He will indicate when he needs to go to the bathroom, increase his communication skills, and try new things. Andrew would also like support with his paid parent support and his CDCS budget to help support him. Andrew will be encouraged to increase his confidence and use his communication to show his wants and needs. Andrew will use his staff to help get him out in the community. Sonia and Robert will meet with the Case manager twice per waiver span and talk about how services are going for him and if there are any needed changes. They will also be in contact with the rest of the CDCS team to ensure that all spending is on track for the waiver span.

What will the case manager do?

CASE MANAGER: Andrew's current case manager/supervisor will continue to coordinate informal and formal supports with Andrew and ensure all his health and safety needs are met 24/7/365 days a year. Case Manager/Supervisor will contact Andrew, guardian, and/or CDCS provider(s) on a regular basis to review Andrew's progress towards his goals/dreams and assist with any needed referrals and advocate on Andrew's behalf. The case manager/supervisor will help Andrew and his team/guardian to resolve any conflicts or disagreements throughout the year and; regarding any issues including any issues regarding his assessment and community support plan. They will coordinate providers to encourage and assist Andrew with indicating when he needs to go to the bathroom, increasing his communication skills, and trying new things.

What will others do?

FAMILY: Andrew's family will continue to provide Andrew with the informal supports and encouragement to assure Andrew's health and safety needs are met 24/7/365 days a year, as well as help him build and maintain all skills to accomplish his goals and dreams in life. They will encourage and assist Andrew with indicating when he needs to go to the bathroom, increasing his communication skills, and trying new things.

GUARDIAN(S): Andrew's parents/guardians will continue to exercise his powers and responsibilities, unless stated differently in the guardianship order of: establishing place of abode (residential); care, comfort and maintenance needs; personal property; medical care; contracts; exercise supervisory authority; and assure eligibility for government benefits. Andrew's parents will complete the annual filing responsibilities as mandated by the court. They will work with Andrew to build and maintain all skills, fostering his ability to stay as independent as possible across all settings, thus helping him to accomplish his goals and dreams in life, while ensuring all his health and safety needs are met.

REPRESENTATIVE PAYEE: Andrew's mother/Representative Payee will continue to assist Andrew with all money management skills. Andrew's mother is the primary person to complete all documents to maintain eligibility for state and federal benefit programs.

What will the provider do?

RESIDENTIAL PROVIDER: Residential Provider will continue to work with Andrew to build and maintain all skills to meet his goals and to ensure all his health and safety needs are met. Provider will work with Andrew to encourage/support on his global goals/dreams and be in regular contact with the guardians and Case Manager/Supervisor on the progress of his goals/dreams. Staff will encourage and assist Andrew with indicating when he needs to go to the bathroom, increasing his communication skills, and trying new things.

RISKS

How will Health and Safety Issues be Addressed?

Andrew lives in his parental home with his family in the community. His parents, Robert Servian and Sonia Tuduri, are guardians. Parents provide daily supports and supervision and a 24 hour plan of care. The guardians are responsible for a 24 hour back up plan. They will continue to ensure that his health and safety needs are met. Guardians will notify case manager of any health and safety concerns. All health and safety issues will be addressed by Andrew's Interdisciplinary Team.
