<p>Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: Mary Jo participates in Special Olympics track and field. Mary Jo enjoys walking and will often laugh and smile while doing so. This outcome is important to ger, but also important for her. It is important that she maintains the strength in her legs to be able to participate in transfers and her cares routine.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Daily, Mary Jo will use her gait trainer in 75% of all opportunities over the next 6 months.</p>
<p>Methods or actions that will be used to support the person and to accomplish the outcome: This outcome will be trailed daily.</p> <p>Staff will approach Mary Jo with an upbeat, positive tone, and ask if she would like to use her gait trainer. If Mary Jo communicates that she does not want to use it, staff will respect her wishes and ask her again later in the day. If Mary Jo uses her vocalizations to communicate yes, the outcome will be documented as achieved (y) and she will be thanked for her communication and choosing to participate.</p> <p>When Mary Jo declines, staff will ask her again later in the day. If she uses her communication to share that she does not want to walk in her gait trainer the second time around, staff will document this as not achieved (n). Staff will honor her known preferences and choices. If Mary Jo uses her vocalizations to communicate yes, the outcome will be documented as achieved (y) and she will be thanked for her communication and choosing to participate.</p>
<p>Changes or modifications necessary to the physical and social environments: Mary Jo will need a quiet environment where she is able to focus on the question.</p>
<p>Equipment and/or materials required: Mary Jo needs access to her gait trainer and her AFO's to properly support her in walking.</p>
<p>Techniques that are used that are consistent with the person's communication mode: Mary Jo communicates through vocalizations, eye pointing, and gestures. Mary Jo understands short verbal questions or directives paired with physical cues.</p>
<p>Techniques that are used that are consistent with the person's learning style: Mary Jo learns through routine and repetition. She is best supported with verbal and physical cues in an upbeat tone of voice.</p>
<p>Data collection method: Documentation will be reordered and charted daily with a "Y" indicating that the outcome was achieved and a "N" indicating that the outcome was not achieved.</p>
<p>Names of staff or positions responsible for implementing the supports and methods: Designated Coordinator (DC), Lead Direct Support Professional (LDSP) and Direct Support Professionals (DSP).</p>
