Summary of Service Outcome and Support Progress

Outcome # 1

Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: Daily, Jennifer will choose a musical preference in 75% of all opportunities.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: Jenny met this outcome in 97% of all opportunities.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

Rationale for the recommendation: Jenny has been very successful with this outcome. It is suggested that she chooses a sensory activity to participate in. Daily, after lunch she will have the opportunity to choose an activity. It is important that she participates in activities that she finds value in and is able to use her communication skills to make choices throughout her day.

Outcome # 2

Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: Daily, Jennifer will choose to use her gait trainer in 75% of all opportunities.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: Jenny met this outcome in 70% of all opportunities.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

Rationale for the recommendation: Jenny is almost meeting this outcome. She is doing well; however, there is still room for improvement. This outcome is important for Jenny, as it is important that she maintains the strength in her legs. It is important to Jenny, as she often expresses a liking for this by saying "tah."

Description of the person's status

Health: Jenny's health has been pretty consistent over the last 6 months. Recently, she has been having troubles sleeping at home. PAI staff work together to allow minimal nap time throughout her day. Staff continue to monitor Jenny for signs or symptoms of illness and report any concerns to her parents. Jenny is also monitored for signs of dehydration and potential ear pain. Jenny's seizures are monitored, and seizure reports are sent home.

What is currently important to the person and for the person: It is important to Jennifer that she have meaningful interactions throughout her day and opportunities to spend time with her favorite staff members. It is important to Jenny that she has adequate fluids, for her beverage and food to be warm, and to make choices. It is important for Jennifer to use her communication skills to advocate for her preferences and that she uses her gait trainer to build strength in her legs.

Status of social relationships and natural supports: Jennifer's family continue to be a very important and meaningful part of her life. She also has many positive relationships with peers and the support people that she has known for a long time. Due to COVID restrictions lessening, Jenny has had the opportunity to visit some of her peers that she hadn't visited with in a while.

Recent inclusion and participation in the community: Due to the coronavirus, PAI has not been visiting the community.

New or ongoing opportunities for the development and exercise of functional and age-appropriate skills, decision making and choice, personal advocacy, and communication:

- **Functional and age-appropriate skills:** Jennifer enjoys participating in a wide variety of activities that develop her functional and age-appropriate skills. Jennifer participated in virtual music therapy and, more recently, in person music therapy. Jenny always enjoys listening to the music, especially the more upbeat songs. She shows a lot of interest in feeling the vibrations and listening to the music but doesn't like the hand over hand assistance in playing the instruments as much. Jenny also just recently started participating in pet therapy. Jenny most often enjoys participating in activities where she can make choices for herself or the group.
- **Decision making and choice:** Jennifer is provided options throughout her day to make choices and decisions. Her decisions are honored. Choice making opportunities are presented to her throughout her daily and group activities and she is encouraged to make decisions and express her preferences throughout her daily routine and while participating in group activities.
- **Personal Advocacy:** Jennifer has been encouraged and supported in her communication to continue having her needs met. Jennifer is a strong self-advocate with support staff whom she knows well and are familiar with her communication style. It is important that Jennifer have support people around her that know her well and advocate for the needs and desires that she may not be able to communicate to the appropriate team members.
- **Communication:** Jennifer continues to communicate routinely throughout her day using vocalizations including "tah" for yes and the "nff" sound for no, gestures, body language, and facial expressions. Jennifer responds best when a task is explained to her, and she is provided with one step verbal prompts in an upbeat tone of voice.

Status of the person's civil and legal rights: Jennifer has private guardianship provided by her parents, Tom and Anne Lofboom.
