Description of the person's status

Health: Over this reporting period, Chanel has had issues with throwing up while at PAI. It appears that Chanel will force herself to do so. PAI communicates when this happens in her communication book. Chanel's mother has been working with doctors to figure out the cause. Chanel has also appeared to be stiffer during this reporting period. She received Botox; however, she is still very stiff. Chanel continues to get in the stander and/or have time on the mat most days.

What is currently important to the person and for the person: It is important to Chanel that she engage in preferred activities of her choosing, that she has time with people who she enjoys and who know her well and understand her nonverbal communications. It is important to Chanel that she be able to move around and reposition. It is important for Chanel to use her stander regularly, to eat and drink daily, and to limit hand-mouthing. It is also important for her to communicate her needs and wants without spitting or grabbing at others.

Status of social relationships and natural supports: Chanel continues to live at home with her parents Joni and Tom. Chanel has many longstanding relationships with staff peers at PAI. Chanel has had the opportunity to get some of the newer individuals to the program as well.

Recent inclusion and participation in the community: PAI is not currently accessing the greater community.

New or ongoing opportunities for the development and exercise of functional and age-appropriate skills, decision making and choice, personal advocacy, and communication:

Functional and age-appropriate skills: Chanel enjoys participating in a wide variety of activities that develop her functional and age-appropriate skills. Chanel participated in music therapy both in person and virtually over the last 6 months. Chanel is very observant and enjoys watching and listening to what others do. In August, PAI had their first in person pet therapy session. Chanel seemed to enjoy this, but again, she enjoyed watching what others were doing.

Decision making and choice: Chanel is provided options throughout her day to make choices and decisions. She makes decisions regarding her daily schedule, personal routine, and the people she wants to spend time with. Chanel makes choices by eye gazing at her preference when offered choices and may push away or throw options she is not interested in. Chanel is encouraged to make choices and advocate for her preference throughout her daily routine and while participating in group activities. Her decisions are honored.

Personal Advocacy: Chanel would like to be encouraged and supported in her communication to continue having her needs met. Chanel is a strong self-advocate with support staff whom she knows well and are familiar with her communication style. It is important that Chanel have support people around her that know her well and advocate for the needs and desires that she may not be able to communicate to the appropriate team members.

Communication: Chanel continues to communicate routinely throughout her day using vocalizations, facial expressions, and body language. With support, Chanel communicates choices by eye gazing, and benefits from the use of pictures or objects during choice making. Chanel communicates her disinterest or frustration when making choices by turning her body away from staff or the activity and by pushing away or throwing things she does not want. Chanel understands one step verbal directions in English and physical/gestural cues.

Status of the person's civil and legal rights: Chanel's mother, Joni Anderson, and Tom Ruzich are her legal guardians. Chanel's civil and legal rights are maintained at PAI. Chanel would like to continue to be aware of her rights, and have a support team who upholds her rights, and advocates on her behalf. Chanel would like to continue having her communication honored and make choices and decisions throughout her day.
