Description of the person's status

Health: Rick has had more seizures over the past 6 months; however, none have been while at PAI. He has had more challenges when it comes to completing his cares. A behavior therapist came in and suggested that his cares be completed on a mat table. This change has gone well for Rick.

What is currently important to the person and for the person: It is important to Rick that he has personal space, time for transitions, and his preferred manipulatives. It is very important that he have the freedom to move around on his own while in his chair and on the floor. Rick's preferred foods and beverages are very important to him, and ensuring they are at the preferred temperature and consistency. It is important for Rick that he uses his communication skills in a safe manner.

Status of social relationships and natural supports: Rick has many longstanding relationships with peers and staff members at PAI. Rick tends to like to stay in his programming room; however, he likes when others visit him throughout the day.

Recent inclusion and participation in the community: Due to the pandemic, PAI has not been visiting the community.

New or ongoing opportunities for the development and exercise of functional and age-appropriate skills, decision making and choice, personal advocacy, and communication:

- **Functional and age-appropriate skills:** This reporting period, Rick has participated in both in person and virtual music therapy sessions. Rick likes to observe what is going on around him. He shows a lot of interest in listening to the YMCA. He will often smile and giggle while it's playing. Rick will also allow staff to touch him with the shells for a short period of time. Rick has also recently participated in pet therapy. He smiled throughout the session and watched the dog roam around. He let the dog come over by him and smiled. Rick enjoyed a lot of meaningful movement activities this period. He played beach ball toss, ring toss, participated in an obstacle course, and bean bag toss. Rick would often shake his head no, that he did not want to participate, but would grab the item and throw it while smiling and giggling.
- **Decision making and choice:** Rick makes choices about his schedule and daily activities using picture cards and the iPad. He is provided options throughout his day to make choices and decisions. His decisions are honored.
- **Personal Advocacy:** Rick is encouraged and supported in his communication to have his needs and desires met. It is important that he have support people around him that know him well and advocate for the needs and desires that he may not be able to communicate to the appropriate team members.
- **Communication:** Rick communicates by signing yes and shakes head no, moves away from things he does not like, and toward things he likes. Rick indicates pleasure by smiling and extreme displeasure by screaming. Rick responds to short verbal directives and physical cues. Rick responds to simple verbal cues and one step directions. He responds to visual cues such as pictures and audio cues such as timers. Rick earns through routine and repetition as well as cause and effect.

Status of the person's civil and legal rights: Rick has private guardianship provided by Kathy Johnson and Kim and Christine Nauer. Rick's civil and legal rights are maintained at PAI. Rick would like to continue to be aware of his rights, have a support team who upholds his rights, and advocates on his behalf. Rick would like to continue having his communication honored and make choices and decisions throughout his day.
