Summary of Service Outcome and Support Progress

Outcome # 1 Weekly, Jordan will choose a game to play with peers 80% of all trials over 12 month recording period.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: Jordan has achieved 95% on this outcome. When given two game choices Jordan will reach out to the one he prefers or look towards it.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

Rationale for the recommendation: Jordan has achieved his goal on this outcome. Jordan would benefit from continuing to work on his choice making skills in another area that is important to him.

New outcome: Weekly, Jordan will choose another room or peer to visit 85% of all trials over a 12 month period. *See CSSPA for rationale.*

Outcome # 2 Daily, Jordan will greet his peers using a prerecorded Mack switch 80% of all trials over a 12 month recording period.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: Jordan has achieved 98% on this outcome. Each morning staff offer Jordan the Mack switch and he is able to press it and greet his peers.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

Rationale for the recommendation: Jordan has achieved his goal on this outcome. Jordan is continuing to learn communication skills via the Mack switch.

New outcome: Daily, Jordan will press the Mack switch and request to listen to music 85% of all trials over a 12 month period. *See CSSPA for rationale.*

Description of the person's status

Health: No health concerns at PAI.

Medications and protocols at PAI:

- Liquids provided by Mom - Give Via G-tube 30 minutes before lunch, Venting as need.
- Give bag of liquid Hope formula 30 minutes following his water through his g-tube - okay to add 6-10 oz of water to formula. Okay to push or plunge as needed. Flush with 2-3mls of water after formula.
- Acetaminophen (TYLENOL) - Give 2 tablets by mouth or G-tube Q6 hours PRN. Max dose: 4000mg in 24 hrs
- Simethicone (GAS RELIEF) 125mg chewable tablet - Give 1 tablet by mouth or G-tube QID, PRN for Flatulence.
- Seizure protocol - Call 911 and give first aid (CPR) if seizure lasts longer than 5 minutes, repeated seizures (3 SZs in one hour) without regaining consciousness, not breathing, unconscious, or cyanotic.

What is currently important to the person and for the person: Things important to Jordan are his family, being comfortable, spending time outside, and being involved. Things important for Jordan are his seizure protocol, his dietary orders, and his team who advocates for him.

Status of social relationships and natural supports: Jordan has a strong relationship with his family.

Recent inclusion and participation in the community: Jordan has not had the opportunity to spend time in the community at this time. PAI has recently started community outings again giving Jordan the opportunity to get out and do something meaningful to him.

New or ongoing opportunities for the development and exercise of functional and age-appropriate skills:

- Pet & Music Therapy: Jordan has participated in pet therapy with Midnight and Zelda. Staff and the dog handler assist Jordan to interact with the therapy dogs as he is interested. PAI has started music therapy in person again. Jordan is often alert during music therapy and is accepting of assistance to play instruments to the music. Jordan also tolerates staff playing drums around him to feel the vibrations.
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- Group Activities: Jordan joined in on camp week this summer where he learned to put up a tent, made outdoor crafts, and told stories around a "campfire". He participated in bird week where he learned about different birds, made bird feeders, and observed different birds. Jordan joined carnival week and participated in face painting and other carnival activities.
- Activities: Jordan plays different card and board games, has created many art projects, joins reading group, sensory activities, and spends time with peers. Jordan has enjoyed time outside with his peers when weather allows making sidewalk chalk art, blowing bubbles, and feeling the breeze. Jordan participated in a patio party where he went "fishing" for prizes, listened to a DJ outside and played bags with his peers. Jordan attended out Made in the Shade party where he played bags outside and went walking with staff.

Decision making and choice: Jordan makes choices about his schedule, community activities, and daily activities. He is provided options throughout his day to make choices and decisions. His decisions are honored.

Personal Advocacy: Jordan is a strong personal advocate and will communicate when he has a need. Jordan is encouraged and supported in his communication to have his needs and desires met. It is important that he have support

people around him that know him well and advocate for the needs and desires that he may not be able to communicate to the appropriate team members.

Communication: Jordan communicates through facial expressions, vocalizations, and gestures.
