Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: “Jason will independently pet the therapy dogs during weekly visits in 80% of all trials over a 12 month recording period.”		
Methods or actions that will be used to support the person and to accomplish the outcome: This outcome will be trialed a minimum of once during each pet therapy visit. Jason enjoys animals but at times needs lots of encouragement to participate, even in activities he enjoys. 1. During weekly pet therapy visits Jason will be given time to observe the therapy dogs and his peers interacting. 2. Prior to his turn to interact with the therapy dogs Jason will be provided with verbal encouragement to pet one or both dogs during the visit.		
If Jason reaches out to interact with or pet one or both therapy dogs independently, the outcome will be documented as achieved (y) Jason will receive positive verbal reinforcement from staff. Should Jason not choose to interact with / pet the therapy dogs, the outcome will be documented as not achieved (n) It will be assumed that Jason would rather observe than participate, however staff may model petting the dogs for Jason, provide point prompts to further encourage him or hand over hand assistance as tolerated by Jason.		
Changes or modifications necessary to the physical and social environments: Jason has a visual impairment and prefers to observe an activity prior to participating. Jason will be given time to observe the activity and his peers during group prior to being encouraged to participate.		
Equipment and/or materials required: Pet Therapy Dogs		
Techniques that are used that are consistent with the person’s communication mode: Jason uses facial expression, gestures and body language to communicate most readily. Jason may use some ASL signs and also may point to his preference if provided with physical options. Jason responds best when encouraged by staff.		
Techniques that are used that are consistent with the person’s learning style: Jason learns through modeling, hand-over-hand assistance, verbal cues and touch prompts/pointing. Jason also benefits from routine & repetition.		
Data collection method: Documentation will be recorded and charted weekly during pet therapy visits. Charting will include a Y or N indicating success.		
Names of staff or positions responsible for implementing the supports and methods: Program Supervisor (PS), Lead Direct Support Professional (LDSP) and Direct Support Professionals (DSP)		

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
