<p><b>Outcome # 1 statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement:</b>                      Twice a week, Matthew will participate in a group activity, for 1 minute or greater, within 75% or greater for a 12 month recording period.</p> <p><b>Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome:</b> Matt has continued to make progress and is achieving his goal in 93% of trials. Matt is encouraged by staff to join the group at the table and offered verbal encouragement to stay and participate for as long as he chooses. Matt has grown in his ability to participate in groups for a minute and often participates for longer. Being able to participate in groups and activities that are of interest is important to Matt and he would benefit from increasing the duration he is able to participate in those activities that interest him with staff supports.</p> <p><b>Recommended outcome:</b> <u>Matthew will participate in a group activity for 2 minutes or longer, 3 times a week in 75% or more of trials in a 12 month recording period.</u></p>	
<p><b>Outcome # 2 statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement:</b>                      Daily, Matt will greet peers or staff with his “hello song” 80% of all trials over a 12 month period.</p> <p><b>Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome:</b> Matt is a social guy, who enjoys greeting others with his “hello song”. He smiles and gets excited as he greets his peers and staff. Matt has shown growth in responding appropriately after being greeted by others. When greeted by the therapy dogs and their handler Matt will immediately start petting them independently will sing them his “Hello” song. Matt would benefit from continuing to develop this social skill.</p> <p><b>Recommended outcome:</b> <u>Daily, Matthew will independently greet a peer or staff with his “hello song” after being greeted in 80% or more of all trials during a 12 month recording period.</u></p>

## Description of the person's status

**Health:** Matt has had no medical concerns at PAI during this period of review.

**Medications & Protocols PAI:** *(Please review & notify PAI immediately if you identify any discrepancy in the information below)*

- **Pantoprazole 40mg tabs** - 1 tab by mouth daily 30 minutes prior to eating. (Takes with bites of fruit)
- **Seizure Protocol** - Call 911 if Seizure greater than 5 minutes or 3 seizures in 6 hours or Respiratory distress/injury due to seizure

**What is currently important to the person and for the person:** Things important to Matt are his rocker, sitting facing windows, room to move around, and singing. Things important for Matthew are his dietary protocol, seizure protocol, and his team who helps advocate.

**Status of social relationships and natural supports:** Matthew lives in an Axis group home and has housemates whom he generally gets along with. Matthew has a strong relationship with his family.

**Recent inclusion and participation in the community:** Due to COVID-19 Matt has had limited opportunity to spend time in the community with PAI. PAI has only recently returned to participating in the greater community as restrictions have eased and vaccination rates have increased. Matt had the opportunity to attend a community outing to Como Lake, where he propelled his wheelchair short distances with staff by his side. When he would fatigue Matt would take his hand off his wheel and grab the staff's hand to let them know that he would like them to navigate his wheelchair. Matthew greeted people by singing his "Hello Song" as people as they walked past. Matt seemed to enjoy his time and would smile, laugh and have positive vocalizations.

**New or ongoing opportunities for the development and exercise of functional and age-appropriate skills:**

- **Pet Therapy:** Matt has had the opportunity to participate in Pet Therapy with Midnight & Zelda the therapy dogs. When Midnight, Zelda and their handler Rich come into the program area Matthew gets excited and starts to smile, laugh, and make positive vocalizations. When the dogs come by him he will immediately start petting them without staff assistance and will sing them his "Hello" song.
- **Music Therapy:** This reporting period Matt participated in Music Therapy both virtually and in-person. There are days where Matthew chooses not to participate in Music Therapy, he communicates this by propelling his wheelchair into the adjacent room. Other Music Therapy Days Matthew will participate enthusiastically, he smiles, laughs, sings "his song". He will make instrument choices and will play the instruments of his choosing.
- **Morning and Afternoon Activities:** Matt has assisted with a lot of arts and crafts using paint, watercolors, markers, glitter, and other materials. Matthew enjoys his 1:1 time with staff, using his choice making skills and reaching for the color(s) and craft items he would like to use and he will place his hands on top of staff hands to assist with the craft project. Matt participates in sensory daily. He enjoys the 1:1 interaction with staff during this time, as he sings "his song", smiles, laughs and reaches for staff's hand. Matthew continues to enjoy lotion massages and having staff use the wooden massager with wheels on his arms/neck.
- **Groups Activities:** Matt chooses to participate in Morning Meetings most days. Matt and his peers talk about the weather, learn about different daily holidays and what happened on this day in history. There is often a video, song or craft project incorporated into the morning meeting. When Matthew is interested he will appear alert during the meeting, often smiling, making positive vocalizations and stay in one spot to listen. When he isn't interested in the topic Matt will independently wheel his chair to a window. Matt participates in different game activities such as Uno, Farkle, Monopoly Card Game, Phase 10 and Skip-Bo. He smiles and laughs when it's his turn. When asked which card he would like to play or discard and he will eye point and reach for the card of his choosing. He smiles and laughs when he picks a draw 2 or 4 or skips one of his peers. Matt seems to enjoy Farkle, a dice game where he will place his hand on the cup and assist with shaking the dice. He will make positive vocalizations, smile, and laugh while shaking the dice and will at times sing "a song". Matt also consistently participates in Book Club, after lunch he will independently propels his wheelchair to a window where he listens to a book on tape or a book being read by staff with his peers. He remains alert and smiles as book club is going on as he watches out the window.

# PAI

**Decision making and choice:** Matt makes choices about his schedule, community activities, and daily activities. He is provided options throughout his day to make choices and decisions. His decisions are honored.

**Personal Advocacy:** Matt is a strong personal advocate and will communicate when he has a need. Matt is encouraged and supported in his communication to have his needs and desires met. It is important that he have support people around him that know him well and advocate for the needs and desires that he may not be able to communicate to the appropriate team members.

**Communication:** Matt communicates through facial expressions, vocalizations, and gestures. Matt will indicate he is finished with something by moving himself away.
