## Individual Abuse Prevention Plan (IAPP)

### Instructions and requirements:

This program is required to establish and enforce ongoing written individual abuse prevention plans as required under Minnesota Statutes, section [626.557](#), subdivision 14 and section [245A.65](#), subdivision 2 (b).

Development and review of the plan: An individual abuse prevention plan shall be developed for each new person as part of the initial individual program plan or service plan required under the applicable licensing rule. The review and evaluation of the individual abuse prevention plan shall be done as part of the review of the program plan or service plan. The person receiving services shall participate in the development of the individual abuse prevention plan to the full extent of the person's abilities. If applicable, the person's legal representative shall be given the opportunity to participate with or for the person in the development of the plan. The interdisciplinary team shall document the review of all abuse prevention plans at least annually, using the individual assessment and any reports of abuse relating to the person. The plan shall be revised to reflect the results of this review.

Plan contents: The plan shall include a statement of measures that will be taken to minimize the risk of abuse to the vulnerable adult when the individual assessment required in section 626.557, subdivision 14, paragraph (b), indicates the need for measures in addition to the specific measures identified in the program abuse prevention plan. The measures shall include the specific actions the program will take to minimize the risk of abuse within the scope of the licensed services, and will identify referrals made when the vulnerable adult is susceptible to abuse outside the scope or control of the licensed services. When the assessment indicates that the vulnerable adult does not need specific risk reduction measures in addition to those identified in the program abuse prevention plan, the individual abuse prevention plan shall document this determination.

Requirements of [626.557](#), subd. 14(b): Each facility, including a home health care agency and personal care attendant services providers, shall develop an individual abuse prevention plan for each vulnerable adult residing there or receiving services from them. The plan shall contain an individualized assessment of: (1) the person's susceptibility to abuse by other individuals, including other vulnerable adults; (2) the person's risk of abusing other vulnerable adults; and (3) statements of the specific measures to be taken to minimize the risk of abuse to that person and other vulnerable adults. For the purposes of this paragraph, the term "abuse" includes self-abuse.

Persons with history of violent crime an act of physical aggression toward others: If the program knows that the vulnerable adult has committed a violent crime or an act of physical aggression toward others, the individual abuse prevention plan must detail the measures to be taken to minimize the risk that the vulnerable adult might reasonably be expected to pose to visitors to the facility and persons outside the facility, if unsupervised. Under this section, a facility knows of a vulnerable adult's history of criminal misconduct or physical aggression if it receives such information from a law enforcement authority or through a medical record prepared by another facility, another health care provider, or the facility's ongoing assessments of the vulnerable adult.

### A. Sexual abuse

#### Specific measures to minimize risk of abuse for each area checked:

- Due to Paul's diagnosis of a developmental disability, Paul has a limited understanding of sexuality. Paul would not understand or recognize an inappropriate sexual interaction.
- Due to Paul not being able to recognize an inappropriate sexual interaction, Paul would likely be cooperative, especially if the perpetrator were someone that Paul knew and trusted. Paul likes to please others and will often times say "yes" and participate in what he thinks others want him to do.
- Paul is unable to be assertive. Paul has very limited verbal communication and may have trouble expressing his feelings to others. Paul likes to please others and will often times say "yes" and participate in what he thinks others want him to do.
- **All Areas:** Paul will be encouraged to participate in social skills classes available at PAI to work on appropriate boundaries and relationships with others. If staff ever found or suspected that Paul was in an abusive situation, staff would remove Paul from the situation immediately and relocate him to a safe location. Staff would notify Paul's guardian and residence and help Paul make a report or contact the authorities if necessary. Staff are always with Paul in the community and at PAI and will help Paul advocate on his behalf. All staff at PAI are mandated reporters. Staff are trained at time of hire on mandated reporting and annually thereafter.

**Referrals made when the person is susceptible to abuse outside the scope or control of this program (Identify the referral and the date it occurred).** No referrals needed at this time.

## B. Physical Abuse

Is the person susceptible to abuse in this area?  Yes (if any area below is checked)  No

### Specific measures to minimize risk of abuse for each area checked:

- Paul is diagnosed with a developmental disability which makes it difficult for Paul to identify potentially dangerous situations. Paul is not always observant of his surroundings and cannot safely propel his wheelchair in unfamiliar settings. Paul is very trusting of others and does not recognize that strangers may be dangerous.
- Paul lacks community orientation skills. Paul is not always observant of his surroundings and cannot safely propel his wheelchair in unfamiliar settings. Paul is very trusting of others and does not recognize that strangers may be dangerous. Paul is limited verbally and would not be able to ask for help or find his way back home if left alone in the community.
- Paul is unable to deal with verbally/physically aggressive persons. Paul is diagnosed with cerebral palsy and uses a manual wheelchair for mobility, which may make it hard for Paul to physically leave the area. Paul is very trusting of others and does not recognize or anticipate that someone else could get aggressive with him.
- **All Areas:** Paul participates in fire and storm drills at PAI to practice how to react in an emergency situation. Staff will always be with Paul in the community and will advocate on Paul's behalf. Staff will model safe pedestrian skills and stranger safety and prompt Paul as needed to follow these. If Paul were in a situation at PAI involving verbally/physically aggressive persons, whether it be at PAI or in the community, staff would intervene and assist Paul in leaving the situation. Staff would ensure Paul felt safe before returning to what he was doing. All staff at PAI are mandated reporters. Staff are trained at time of hire on mandated reporting and annually thereafter.

## C. Self Abuse

Is the person susceptible to abuse in this area?  Yes (if any area below is checked)  No

### Specific measures to minimize risk of abuse for each area checked:

- Paul is unable to care for his self-help needs due to physical limitations caused by his diagnoses of cerebral palsy and spastic quad. Paul needs assistance with restroom care, hygiene, eating, and most tasks that require fine motor skills or a large range of motion.
- Paul lacks self-preservation skills. Paul does not recognize potentially dangerous situations. Paul cannot safety determine if a person can be trusted or if an obstacle or situation is safe.
- **All Areas:** Staff will assist Paul with using a urinal at PAI and with a transfer belt and a 2 person assist for bowel movement care in a private cares room. Staff will physically assist as needed with hand washing, eating, and any task requiring fine motor skills or a large range of motion. Staff are always with Paul in the community and at PAI and will advocate on Paul's behalf, prompting him to follow safety rules when needed. Paul participates in fire and storm drills at PAI. All staff at PAI are mandated reporters. Staff are trained at time of hire on mandated reporting and annually thereafter.

**Referrals made when the person is susceptible to abuse outside the scope or control of this program (Identify the referral and the date it occurred).** No referrals needed at this time.

## D. Financial Exploitation

### Specific measures to minimize risk of abuse for each area checked:

- Paul is unable to handle financial matters independently. When Paul is going to participate in a community outing that requires cash, a funds request form will be sent home with Paul a few days prior to the outing. Paul will bring cash in with him that day and keep it with him the duration of the day.
- **All Areas:** Staff will help Paul make the transaction, ensure he has gotten a receipt and correct change, and help Paul secure the change back with his belongings. PAI does not resume responsibility of participant funds. Paul's residence helps Paul manage and track his finances at home. All staff at PAI are mandated reporters. Staff are trained at time of hire on mandated reporting and annually thereafter.
