Summary of Service Outcome and Support Progress

Outcome #1:

Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: Kyle will learn a fact about the Green Bay Packers weekly 75% of all trials for a 12 month recording period.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: Kyle is achieving this outcome in 81% of trials. Staff look up a new fact about the Green Bay Packers each week to share with Kyle and Kyle will actively listen as staff share a new fact with him. Kyle likes the Green Bay Packers and appeared to enjoy learning something new about his favorite team each week.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

Rationale for the recommendation: Kyle has met his goal in this area. While Kyle appeared to enjoy learning something new about his favorite team each week, he also enjoys being read to and listening to stories. It is important to him that he be included in activities and encouraged to make choices. The proposed outcome will provide intentional time for Kyle to build his choice making and self-advocacy skills.

Recommended replacement: Weekly, Kyle will choose a short story, book or Packer fact to read/listen to in 85% or more trials over the next year.

Outcome #2:

Outcome statement with measurable and observable criteria for outcome achievement: Kyle will select a sensory item 75% of all trials for a 12 month recording period.

Summary of progress toward achieving this outcome: Kyle is achieving this outcome in 100% of trials. Kyle is offered two sensory item choices and will hold the sensory activity of his choice in his hand. Kyle enjoys sensory activities and actively participates in them with staff assistance.

Recommendation for implementing this outcome: Continue Change Discontinue

Rationale for the recommendation: Kyle is achieving this outcome in all trials and is unlikely to develop any further skill with continued trials. Kyle should continue to be offered sensory choices and the opportunity to make choices informally during sensory time. Kyle enjoys sensory activities and frequently chooses to have a lotion massage. The proposed outcome will provide an opportunity for Kyle to engage in an enjoyable activity and increase his participation in his ADLs and self-care.

Recommended replacement: Daily, Kyle will dispense lotion for a massage with hand over hand support in 85% or more trials over the next year.

Description of the person's status

Health: Kyle has no health concerns at PAI during this reporting period. Staff continue to monitor Kyle for seizure activity, assist him with his daily medications, nutrition and fluids. Staff also complete vest treatments as requested by his guardian.

Medications and treatments received at PAI:

- **Isotonic Jevity** – 1can + 60ml water via gravity, QID. Follow with an additional 60ml water flush. Okay to administer per slow bolus prior to an outing.
- **Baclofen** – 10mg tab – 3tabs (30mg) via g-tube, q6h
- **Simethicone** – 1.2mL (80mg) via g-tube, daily after feeding.
- **Water** – 450mL water via slow drip daily at 2pm
- **Diazepam Intensol** 5mg/1mL – 20mg/4mL via g-tube, PRN for seizures >3 mins

What is currently important to the person and for the person:

To: Kyle is a huge fan of the Green Bay Packers and likes football, and likes being a part of the group. Kyle enjoys going to the cabin and spending time with my family. Kyle likes being read to or listening to books on tape. He also enjoys attending Music Therapy. **For:** Kyle has an NPO order and receives his nutrition and meds through his g-tube. Kyle's eyes work independently so please bring objects to a close distance of one foot. He has a seizure diagnosis.

Status of social relationships and natural supports: Kyle lives at home and has strong family supports. Kyle enjoys being around his peers while at PAI and is encouraged to develop and maintain relationships with his peers at the Linden site.

Recent inclusion and participation in the community: Due to COVID-19 Kyle has had limited opportunity to spend time in the community with PAI. PAI has only recently returned to participating in the greater community as restrictions have eased and vaccination rates have increased. Kyle had the opportunity to attend a community outing to Wal-Mart; where he did some window shopping and appeared to enjoy browsing the aisles with friends.

New or ongoing opportunities for the development and exercise of functional and age-appropriate skills:

Music & Pet Therapy: Kyle has participated in Music Therapy both virtually and in-person this reporting period. He appears to enjoy the music and the different instruments played during group. Kyle responds positively when instruments are played on his arms and legs. Kyle has participated in Pet Therapy with Midnight, Zelda & Beny the therapy dogs on several occasions. Kyle will pet the therapy dogs with assistance and seems to enjoy when they are around.

Morning and afternoon activities: Kyle enjoys playing games with his peers both using game board/cards or on the iPad. Kyle also participates in arts & craft activities where he does well making choices and will tolerate hand over hand assistance while painting. Kyle continues to enjoy sensory experiences throughout his day. Kyle enjoys having a hand lotion and seems to enjoy using the sensory cart which has many different items on it such as lights, bubbles, bags filled with different things/textures etc. Kyle participated in the daily Morning Meeting where he enjoys listening to staff read about "This Day in History", talk about the weather and learn about any daily holidays/celebrations using the CheckiDay website.

Decision making and choice: Kyle is continuing to work on choice making throughout the day of activities or events he'd like to participate in. Kyle makes choices about his schedule, community activities, and daily activities. He is provided options throughout his day to make choices and decisions. His decisions are honored.

Personal advocacy: Kyle is a strong personal advocate and will communicate when he has a need. Kyle is encouraged and supported in his communication to have his needs and desires met. It is important that he have support people around him that know him well and advocate for the needs and desires that he may not be able to communicate to the appropriate team members.

PAI

Communication: Kyle communicates through vocalizations, body language and facial expressions. Kyle is also able to eye blink to answer yes/no questions. When Kyle is uncomfortable or not enjoying something Kyle may wiggle a lot in his chair to communicate his discomfort.

Status of the person's civil and legal rights: Kyle has private guardianship provided by his parents.
