


Agency-Wide Updates

Inappropriate


- A person is throwing large objects on the floor
- This is property damage
- This is NOT an emergency

Appropriate

- The person picks up pieces of the damaged item
- They use the object as a weapon against another person, or to harm themselves
- This is an emergency because someone could be harmed



**If you need to do an EUMR,
you must ensure the procedure
is not implemented:**


- }] with a child in a manner that constitutes sexual abuse, neglect, physical abuse, or mental injury
- }] with an adult in a manner that constitutes abuse or neglect
- }] to violate a person's rights and protections
- }] to restrict a person's normal access to a nutritious diet, drinking water, adequate ventilation, necessary medical care, ordinary hygiene facilities, normal sleeping conditions, or necessary clothing
- }] to deny contact with legal counsel, a legal representative, or next of kin
- }] as a substitute for adequate staffing, for the convenience of staff, as punishment, or as a consequence



**If you need to do an EUMR,
you must ensure the procedure
is not implemented:**

using prone restraint






Once the risk of physical
harm is no longer present,
you must release the restraint
IMMEDIATELY!

You can tell if someone is calm:

- if their body is less tense
- if they say they are ready to be released
- if their voice and words indicate they are calming down

*If there are signs of
distress the restraint
must be released*

IMMEDIATELY!



**It is your job to prevent the
use of manual restraint.
This ensures the safety of the
people you support and yourself.**
