Participation and experience within a Radiology Department serves as a valuable tool to gain insight into the career, procedure flow and communication skills/tactics. Through this experience, students will have the opportunity to observe:

- The care of patients within the Radiology department. (Diagnostic and Advanced Imaging areas)
- The fundamental practices within a procedural routine that must be adhered to when performing radiographic studies
- Appropriate written, oral, and nonverbal communication with patients, the public and members of the healthcare team within the clinical setting.
- General radiation safety and protection practices associated with radiographic and fluoroscopic exams

Assignment Guidelines

Using your clinical experience, identify/answer/discuss your experience by addressing ALL items identified in the assignment.

The typed assignment will be reviewed and focus will be on completeness, content, quality and grammar, as well as adherence to the following guidelines (please see the attached rubric for further guidance with grading in addition to what is written below):

- Answers to all of the items/questions must be documented within the 'Written Assignment Form'
- Must be organized and address all corresponding questions/topics
- Complete sentences must be used
- Minimum 4 pages in length (format)
- Must be typed in Times New Roman size 12 font (format)
- Single spaced answers (format)
- Adhere to HIPAA and protection of personal health information
- Do not include technologist's names in the written assignment
