

# O.J. Simpson Case Study

## *Crime Scene Errors and Evidence Mistakes*

10. How did the defense dismantle the prosecution's case against O.J.?
11. What were the prosecution's arguments?
12. What was the verdict of the criminal case?
13. In 1997, who filed a civil suit against Simpson? What was the outcome of the trial?
14. Why was the Goldman family awarded the rights to "If I Did It"?
15. What was Simpson convicted of in 2007? What was his sentence?
16. What happened on July 20, 2017?
