

- A. Moment at which the main character fails or succeeds.
- B. Series of events, actions, reactions of characters from the beginning, middle, to the end of the story.
- C. Background information of a story.
- D. The people, animals, or other "beings" in a narrative. Can be fictional or real.
- E. Subsequent conflicts with a lot of tension/suspense that lead to the climax.
- F. The driving force or problem of a story. Can be external or internal.
- G. All the events that occur after the protagonist fails or succeeds.
- H. An insight about human life that is revealed in a literary work. The writer's message (lesson or moral). Not a single word.
- I. The author discloses the secrets of the plot, "unravels" the mysteries, and answers the reader's questions. He closes the story, often putting an interpretive spin on the story's elements, hinting at the theme.
- J. The time, place, season, or when and where a story occurs.
