

Medieval Satire Videos

You are to study your topic of choice and write a historically accurate script for educational purposes. The video may be in the form of a skit, commercial, public service announcement, or a movie trailer. Each video must have a script, costumes, and background set. It must be acted out by all students in the group. The final video must be submitted no later than Thursday November 9th on Edvance. We will watch them as a class on Friday November 10th or on Monday November 13th.

The purpose of this video is two-fold:

1. For you to learn about the Medieval Era.
2. For your video to educate your classmates in an entertaining way on your subject.

Your History Project for Medieval time period:

1. Must be at least five minutes and no longer than 10 minutes.
2. Must be historically accurate.
3. Must have some sort of costumes and setting.
(Be creative and think outside the box: you don't need to rush out to buy costumes!)
4. You are given the freedom to be as creative and fun as you want! As long as your video is respectful of school policies and follows the guidelines stated above and for each topic.

CHOICES:

1. **Pepin II, Charles Martel, and Pepin the Short:** Explain who they are, what they did, and the significance of how they affected who would have power in the future.
2. **The Story of Charlemagne:** Include his rise to power, his
3. **Feudal System:** Include castle life under the Feudal System, the caste system of king, lords, and vassals.
4. **Manor Life:** Include explanations of all the types of individuals that live in a Manor/Village life making a living and providing for the others in the village.
5. **Battle of Hastings:** Include Harold the Earl of Wessex and King William of Normandy when it happened and why. Who won and what the winner did after the battle. You should end with the purpose of the Domesday Book.
6. **Magna Carta:** Include the events leading up to the signing of the Magna Carta, what was the purpose of it, where was it signed, who signed it and its historical significance today in America.
