

American History: Progressive Era presentation:

You will be given a topic to research and then teach/present to the class. This will be as a test grade, so be sure to do your best and follow instructions. This is a very important chapter in American History. What we see happening today in the news: in our cities, schools, families, churches, and government can be traced back to the ideas that were accepted and implemented during this period. The people of the Progressive Era removed God from their society and replaced Him with man's reason and logic. Science became their god, and by rejecting God, they looked to their own understanding instead of God's Word. Now 100 yrs later we see the results.

Requirements.

1. You must time your presentation so that it is five minutes long.
2. You must give a history and background of your subject: giving details of the events, places, times, and people surrounding your topic and why it was important during the progressive Era.
3. How did your topic have an impact on society for the good and or bad during it's time.
4. What short term and long-term affects did it/they have on American Society?
5. Was your subject or event in line with Biblical Truth or in the case of a person: have a biblical worldview? You must give examples to support your answer.
6. Do you see any connections to our American Society today because of your topic having prevalence during the Progressive era.
7. In the conclusion of your presentation: state to the class what have you learned from your topic; did it help you understand our culture today? Were there any mistakes made that we could learn to avoid today? Was there anything positive that we could benefit from doing today? Is there anything you would have done differently back then knowing what you know today?

8. You may NOT use power point or a computer in your presentation.
9. You must have a visual aide to go with your presentation (it must be large enough for the class to see)
10. You may put an outline on notecards to help you remember your presentation. However, you must make eye contact with the audience during the presentation and be able to speak freely to the audience.
11. On the day of the presentation, you must hand in your grading rubric with your name on the upper right-hand corner. You will have your research notes and presentation outline stapled to your rubric. It will be included as part of your grade
