

4. If you do not really see a hair or fiber in the area, place one or two for this lab experience. Take the next two pictures of the hairs/fibers you found BEFORE and AFTER you place an evidence marker by it. (Use paper or notecards to create your evidence markers) **(Photos 2 and 3)**
5. There are three tools that you can use to now pick up that hair/fiber. Based on what you have available in your home, recover (pick up) the piece/s of evidence. Take a picture showing how you picked up the piece of evidence **(Photo 4)**
6. Make a paper bindle to protect your hair/fiber. Take a picture or video of you making a bindle and submit it along with this lab submission **(Photo 5)**

Post-Lab Questions:

1. How would you decide if a fiber found at a crime scene is possible evidence or not?
2. Are hair and fibers class or individual evidence? Explain.
3. Was the hair/fiber in this lab easy to find? What areas did you search while looking for your evidence?
