



The American Education System

There are many different kinds of schools in the United States. Most children go to public schools that are free, but there are also private schools that students pay to attend. Free public education begins with kindergarten (the first year of elementary school) and finishes with the twelfth grade (the last year of high school).

Many parents send their young children to day-care centers and pre-schools before kindergarten. They pay for their children to attend these schools. In most states, children do not have to attend kindergarten, but they must start elementary school in the first grade when they're six years old. They have to attend school for ten years or more. Each state has its own law about when students can leave school.

Most elementary schools have five grades plus kindergarten. After elementary school, children usually go to middle school for sixth, seventh, and eighth grade. Most students enter high school in the ninth grade and graduate after four years.

Many people continue their education after high school at a technical or vocational school, a two-year community college, a four-year college, or a university. Technical and vocational schools teach



students the skills they need for a job. Community colleges also have vocational programs that prepare students for work.

Four-year colleges can be very expensive. Many students spend their first two years of college at a community college. After that, they can apply to study for two more years at a four-year college and then graduate. Some colleges are part of large universities. These universities also have graduate schools where students continue to study after they graduate from college. Students who want to be doctors, for example, go to college for four years and then study at a medical school in a university.
